Creative Commons licenses

provide a standard way for content creators to grant someone else permission to use their work. A Creative Commons license is used when an author wants to give people the right to share, use, or build upon a work that they have created.



original work. You can't change the original work in any way or use it commercially.

This license allows for redistribution, commercial and non-commercial, as long as it is passed along unchanged and in whole, with credit to the original

This license lets you remix, tweak, and build upon the original work even for

commercial purposes, as long as you credit the original work and license your new creations under the identical terms. This license is often compared to "copyleft" free and open source software licenses. All new works based on the work should carry the same license, so any derivatives will also allow commercial use. 


